

BOAT No.38 – Junction of Pond Road and Furze Hill Road to Parish boundary with Bramshott on Ludshott Common

The track begins at a small NT car park at the junction of Pond Road and Furze Hill Road (Pic 1). There is a NT sign by the car park, but no guide post to the BOAT.

It can be muddy at times (Pic 2) – and particularly after rainstorms the track can become a stream. There is an alternative parallel path for walkers on the right of the BOAT for the worst part.

At a National Trust sign on the left (Pic 3), tracks go up into the woods and can make an interesting diversion joining up with FP510.

Shortly before the end of the BOAT, a small concrete dam is passed on the right (Pic 4) with a path over into Gentles Copse.

The parish boundary with Bramshott is not well-defined at this point, though marked by a 2-metre-high bank elsewhere in the vicinity (see 'National Trust paths in Gentles Copse').

This is the end of the BOAT (Pic 5): straight ahead is a junction of three Bramshott bridleways leading off in various directions across Ludshott Common. Turning sharply to the left, Bramshott FP59 rises and follows the parish boundary north-east.
